IVPSA: EngAging in Community

The EngAging in Community project led by VEQ is part of l'Initiative pour l'inclusion sociale des personnes aînées: un enjeu collectif, launched by l'Institut sur le vieillissement et la participation sociale des aînés de l'Université Laval (IVPSA). It aims to promote the social inclusion of seniors in the Québec Metropolitan Community (QMC). It is being carried out thanks to a financial contribution from Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) and will end in 2025.

The Initiative and its seven projects are part of a territorial approach to collective impact that is both intersectoral and interdisciplinary and involves seniors themselves. VEQ's actions will focus on reducing the digital divide, and social participation, via the implementation of intra and intergenerational activities.
