I am so proud of our Newcomers Program. This year the growth continued from last year at an incredible pace. 998 Newcomers were supported by VEQ, an increase of 56% from last year! In addition, 487 individuals participated in the Newcomer events, geared at continuing to support individuals and families making connections and settling their roots in our wonderful region.

Investment in the cohesive nature of our community has also been a great success this year with the renewal of many important partnerships. The positive outcomes of these

partnerships have been stakeholder meetings, many events, and the engagement and participation of many community members.

Among the diverse and incredible programming VEQ brought to the table this past year, I want to highlight the incredible success of the activities for our members that are 50+. Out and About, knitting circles, and pottery workshops were among the many incredible opportunities for our members to spend time together and feel the support within our English-speaking community.

MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

What a remarkable year it has been, and we're lucky, we didn't do it alone!

We maintained our strong partnership with the Jeffery Hale Community Partners (JHCP) and the Jeffery Hale Community Services (JHCS) and continued to collaborate on valuable programming for the English-speaking community. This was done through committee work, info sessions, and jointly run programs such as the Volunteer Income Tax Program.

Through the Employment Strategy, we established strong partnerships with 10 employment sector organizations, worked together to increase the accessibility of their services to English speakers, and collaborated on the implementation of several events. We also continued to publish our weekly #JobTipTuesday posts, highlighting job search tools, workshops, and events, helping connect community members to relevant resources.

Our satellite office and Community Space in Shannon were bustling with activity over the course of the year. 52 activities and workshops were carried out in our Community Space between April 2022 and March 2023. Having that local presence has allowed us to solidify important partnerships with many stakeholders and decision makers and allowed us to bring programming directly to residents living in the northern perimeter of the city.

The My Québec City Podcast project saw the recording of 42 episodes by 53 participants. VEQ delivered 14 podcast workshops and supplied the high schools, CEGEP

and Eastern Québec Learning Centre with the equipment they will need to continue podcasting in the future. I can't wait to hear what they record next! You're in for a treat if you haven't yet had a chance to listen to it.

VEQ's accomplishments are the result of a dedicated and passionate aroup individuals who carry out the organization's mission and work together to implement interesting programming and activities for the benefit of the community. Working alongside such a great group of collaborators is a privilege. 
