We're already excited to do this again next year. We look forward to seeing you for Fall Fest 2025!















#### PFRT Wehinar

We were pleased to see several of our partners and community members in attendance for the webinar launch of the Provincial **Employment** Roundtable's (PERT) report on the Employment Profile of English speakers in Capitale-Nationale on October 30.

"The report, which builds off of PERT's previous work, shows that the income gap between English and French speakers has doubled since 2016, underscoring growing economic disparities between these communities.

A key factor contributing to this divide is the perceived gap in language skills, which limits career advancement opportunities for English speakers and results in lower wages."
